

Please find below the homework grid for this half term. Our topic this half term is Super Hero Me! There are opportunities for writing, maths and creativity. Please feel free to record it using photographs, videos, models, drawing and writing. Homework should be **completed once a week**, and returned by a Thursday into the homework drawer outside the classroom. Homework that has been returned will be marked, and shared, on Friday.

In addition, maths homework on mymaths.co.uk will be set once a week for year 2s, and once a fortnight for year 1s. Spellings are sent out on a Monday, to be tested on a Friday.

Please read as much as possible with and to your child, as this is vital for their reading skills to develop, and will create a reading culture within our classroom.

Design your own super hero - what will their power be? What will people call them?	Do you know your number bonds to 10? Or 20? Or 100? Write as many as you can
Be a super hero around the home, and use your senses to discover what you can see, smell, hear, taste and touch!	Have you got a personal hero? Write about them - why are they important to you?
Draw a picture of your personal hero. They could be doing something heroic!	Make a super hero lair in a box!
Use information books and the web to find out about Guinness World Record holders and their superhuman achievements.	Listen and hum along to the theme tune from your favourite superhero TV programme. Can you remember all the words and perform to the class?
Be a 'superkid' at home. Maybe you tidied your room or helped wash the dishes? Take a photo or draw a picture, or write about what you did and how it helped your family.	If you could have a super power, what would it be? Would you be able to fly? Become invisible? See through buildings? Write about some of the adventures you might have.
Year 1s Count in 2s, 5s and 10s!	Year 2s Count in 3s!
Year 1s Practise writing the numbers 1-10. Challenge - can you write them in words?	Year 2s Practise your 2 times tables. Remember, when you times by two you are doubling! Doubles, doubles, I can add doubles!
